

Body markings are strictly prohibited on areas marked in red

- Head
- Face
- Neck, including the v-neck area
- Hands*



***EXCEPTION**

- One wedding ring style tattoo may be worn on the ring finger of either hand.
- Limited to a total of one ring tattoo - measuring 3/8" (9.525mm) wide, located between the knuckle and finger joint.

Body markings are strictly prohibited on areas visible above the lapel of a standard issue Class C (v-neck, short sleeved) uniform shirt and below the sleeve of a standard issue Class B (long sleeved) uniform shirt (i.e., the neck, head, face, and hands).

- No agency employee shall possess any offensive body marking.
- The Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent is responsible for determining whether a body marking is offensive, unauthorized, and/or prohibited.
- The Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent reserves the right to require an employee to cover any body marking that was previously permitted in the course of employment that has been determined to be currently inappropriate.
 - » The Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent will determine the approved method of covering body markings once the body markings are deemed inappropriate.
